Information for Parents/Carers and Children



We understand this has been a very trying and upsetting time for all families, with many unknowns. Our aim now is to support and reassure your child with what school will be like, ensuring school is a happy place and that they look forward to learning again.

In this leaflet we've outlined plans on how we will be supporting your child. If you have any questions that are not answered in the leaflet please do get in touch.

How will it work?

From Monday 29th June our school will be open to small groups in each class until Friday 24th July.

Classes will be split into three groups of no more than 7 pupils. Our groups are going to be called 'Teulu' - family. Friday will be a Distance Learning Day.

Our Keyworker provision, Teulu'r Enfys, will continue from 8:10am - 3:30pm. Infants will be using the Foundation Phase Resource Base, Mr Lloyd's class, and Juniors will be using the hall. The keyworker children will get to see their teacher once a week in their small group.

How many days will my child be in school?

Your child will have the opportunity to attend 5 days in their small group over the four week period, giving them time to familiarise themselves with how we are working and see some of their classmates again.

Where will I drop off / pick up?

We ask that one parent drops off / picks up at the school gates. Both gates will be open and a member of staff will be there to greet your child. Infants are to use Gate A and Juniors Gate B

At the gate you will be asked to answer a few short questions about your child's health that day, with regards to Covid-19 symptoms. We will have markers near the gates to support social distancing and ask that once your child is dropped off you leave to allow for other parents to come to the gate. If you are able to walk to school we also ask that you do so to reduce the number of cars near school.

What if I have got children in different year groups?

We've planned for siblings to be in on the same day. The children can be dropped off/picked up at the same time. A member of staff from your child's class will be there to greet them and will take them to the appropriate class.

Does my child need their uniform?

Your child will not be required to wear their school uniform. Your child **will need** to wear clean, fresh clothes when they are in school. Wash these clothes when your child gets home.

What if my child shows symptoms during the day?

If your child shows symptoms of Covid-19 while in school, he/she will be taken to the Isolation Area by a member of staff who will stay with them while we contact you. We will ask you to come and collect your child as soon as possible and follow the relevant guidelines.

Where will the children have break times?

Each class will have their own break time outside. At any one time only one Infant class will be on their yard and one Junior class on their yard.



Where will my child have lunch?

The children will have lunch in their own class. Every child will need to bring their own packed lunch and water bottle to school which will be wiped down by a member of staff upon arrival. Children will go out to play with their class either before or after eating their lunch.

How will social distancing work in school?

We've been busy measuring classrooms and reorganising furniture. Each class has reduced furniture and set areas for the children to play and work.



A large part of our work will be helping your child to understand how to maintain social distancing and why. We'll be using symbols to support our pupils in understanding the ways of moving around school and there are signs displayed.

We have markers set on the floor and areas around school. The adults will remind the children to move safely and maintain social distancing. Children will enter and exit the school building through the same door every time. Different classes have been allocated specific doors for this.

What about using the toilet?

The pupils will be encouraged to go to the toilet at break times and will be supported by staff at any time of the day to help them follow social distancing and hand washing.

How will hand washing work?

Each class has a 'Snuffle Station' so the children can wash/sanitise their hands at specific times throughout the day e.g. when entering/exiting the class; before/after break times and lunch times. The school will be thoroughly cleaned by our cleaning staff and incidentally throughout the day by our staff.



Will my child be doing work and learning?

Our focus at this time will be to support our pupils' emotional needs and well-being, as they will have many questions and we are sure there will be some confusion. We will be 'Catching up, Checking in, Preparing for summer and September'.

We will be learning outside as much as possible and learning indoors will work through projects that the children can continue with at home to support their distance learning.

What will happen on Fridays when no classes are in school?

Every Friday will be a Distance Learning Day, where your child can upload pictures to SeeSaw or share on PurpleMash and continue projects from their class online.

We're looking forward to starting new projects and welcoming you back to start our learning again!
